- It is now gaining national significance with international connections



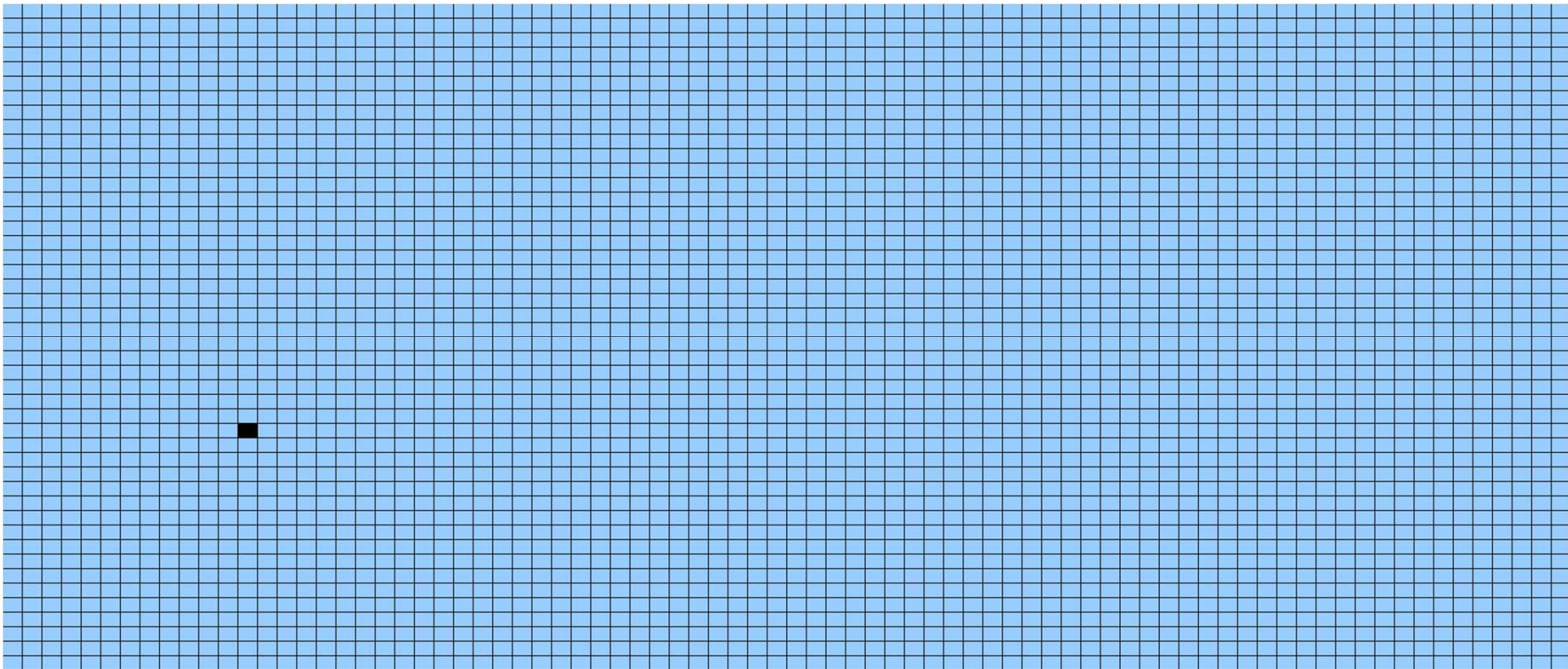




Sex and Scallops

- Scallops can grow 30 to 50% faster in mid-water than they do on the seafloor
- 35,000 Scallops can be grown in 1 square meter of water space. That's 35,000,000 scallops in one hectare
- Or... 350,000,000 in ten hectares
- We can do the same thing with Oyster, Paua and many other species
